## October 2020

October was a generally cloudy and wet month with near-average temperatures, with the last third of the month particularly wet and windy. It was briefly settled but still mainly cloudy from the 14th to 18th. The mean temperature for the month was 0.2 °C below the long-term average. Rainfall was 123% of average and sunshine was only 68% of average, well below normal giving the third dullest October in a series from 1919.

With the paucity of sunshine, only nine species of butterfly were recorded in October, the lowest total for four years. Cloudy nights meant moths fared better, but the count of eighty macro moth species in October was not exceptional (2019 count 66, 2018 count 100 macros).

### **Clifden Nonpareil Update**

In 2020 the annual count of Clifden Nonpareil moths in Gwent has risen to 30 individuals between 14<sup>th</sup> August and 27<sup>th</sup> October, the sites being Newport (10 including 4 in one night), Tintern (9), Penallt (4), Great Crwys, Hendre (2), Dingestow (2) and singletons at three sites (Llandogo, Usk and Risca).

An earlier record has recently come to light of one at Tintern in 2018, which would be the second VC35 record, only one week after the first Gwent record at Undy on 25<sup>th</sup> Sept 2018.

#### Wales Big Butterfly Count Results

. Almost 3000 records of 17 butterfly species were submitted between Friday 17 July and Sunday 9 August by people in Gwent as part of Butterfly Conservation's UK "Citizen Science" survey project, the highest ever participation within Gwent. All the 2020 Big Butterfly Count records for VC35 have now been forwarded to me to add to the county butterfly database.

The table of Welsh results was published in last month's newsletter (No 166).

## **Other Highlights**

A few significant records from earlier in the year have only recently been submitted:

- 29<sup>th</sup> May A Pine Hawk (*Sphinx pinastri*) to light at Tintern. The second county record after one at Dingestow on 28<sup>th</sup> July 2019. This may well be the next large moth to colonise Gwent. (John Dawson).
- 15<sup>th</sup> June The micro *Sitochroa verticalis* (Lesser Pearl) at Tintern. A new species for VC35.







Red Sword-grass
